Thank you for the opportunity to apply for membership on the Workforce Investment Board. As noted in my application, I am a relative newcomer to Santa Cruz County. When I arrived here in August 1998, I took advantage of Leadership Santa Cruz to learn about community issues, opportunities, and challenges.

Since that time, I have become more familiar with the county's constituencies as a result of my position as the Program Director at the Community Foundation. It was through this position that I got acquainted with public and nonprofit agency providers and began to understand the relationship between their work and the local economy.

In 1999, the Community Foundation launched the county's first study of the nonprofit sector and its impact on the local economy—in terms of services provided, employment, and revenue generation. This Nonprofit Survey provided me with invaluable information regarding the county's public and nonprofit agency providers and the relationship between their work and the local economy.

In the same year, my participation in the HRA sponsored Clusters Project, which invited business, government, and nonprofit leaders to explore the intersection of training and employment in SC County, made me aware of the gap between employment opportunities and the availability of a trained workforce.

As a member of the advisory committee for ChildCare Ventures, an intermediary established to facilitate the development of childcare facilities in the county, I have seen first hand the critical role that childcare plays in our economy. Its availability not only fosters healthy child development, but also contributes to a stable workforce.

Participation in the activities referenced above has piqued my interest in community economics and workforce development issues. Serving on the Workforce Investment Board would help me stay abreast of trends in local employment and the availability of training opportunities. Such information could help inform the Community Foundation's future grantmaking.

My career in the nonprofit sector includes employment as program planner, line staff, fundraiser, and program administrator. Over the fifteen years that I have been involved in philanthropy at the local, national and international levels, I have developed a unique understanding of the value that the nonprofit sector offers to the life of a community. I would welcome the opportunity to share my knowledge and positively impact our community by serving on the Workforce Investment Board.
