CHAPTER 2.82 AGRICULTURAL POLICY ADVISORY COMMISSION

2.82.010 Established—Statutory authority.

The Agricultural Policy Advisory Commission is established under the authority of Government Code Section 31000.1-25208, in compliance with SCCCChapter 2.38-SCCC. [Ord. 2521, 1978; prior code § 3.59.010].

2.82.020 Metribership.

- (A) The Commission shall consist of seven members appointed as follows.
- (A) Filve of the members shall be voting members. The voting members shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors and shall be, residents of the County, appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Each Supervisor shall nominate one person to serve on the Commission. Membership on the Commission shall be open to those who are active in the production of agricultural commedities or a related agricultural industry.
- (B) There shall be, in addition, two fision members appointed, (The other two members of the County Commission are the County Director of the County Cooperative Agricultural Extension, and the County Agricultural Commissioner. These individuals, who shall have seats on the Commission but shall not vote. [Ord. 2521, 1976; prior code § 3.69.030].

2.82.040 Organization and procedures.

(A) General Organization. The Commission may satisfied its own rules and procedures insofar as they comply in all respects with the provisions of <u>SCCC</u>Chapter <u>2.38-SCCC</u>. The Commission may also, from time to time, consult with authorities in the field.

(B) Gouttly-Staff Support.

- (1) The Agricultural Commissioner, or their designed to Department, shall provide staff support for the Commission. The Agricultural Commissioner Director of the Department, or their his designeste, shall serve as Administrative Secretary to the Commission, prepare minutes of Commission meetings and annual reports from the Commission to the Board of Supervisors, and shall reports of all minutes, reports and recommendations submitted to the Board of Supervisors by the Commission.
- (2C) Planning Department Support. With regard to Commission duties under subsection (B) of this section, (The Planning Department shall cooperate in providing staff support for the

Commission. Such support shall consist of application receipt and processing, <u>agenda</u>

<u>preparation and public noticing</u>, staff report preparation, and presentation of appeals of Agricultural Policy Advisory Commission decisions to the Board of Supervisors. [Ord. 2677, 1978; Ord. 2521, 1978; prior code § 3,59,060].

2.82.050 Powers and duties.

The Commission shall performewereles the following duties responsibilities:

- (A) Advice and assist the Board of Supervisors by providing information on the County's agricultural industry, and evaluating matters referred to the Commission by the Board;
- (B) Review, in deoperation with the Planning Department, proposed development projects having the potential to affect agricultural lands, as designated on the County's Agricultural Resources Map. Such review shall consist of buffer setback determinations, agricultural viability determinations, agricultural tand use regulation and policy interpretations, recommendations regarding land division proposed in or edicining. CA or AP Zone Districts, for Type 10 agricultural land, and recommendations regarding proposed amendments to the agricultural land type designations as shown on the Agricultural Resources Map. The Commission shall also perform the functions specified in SCCC 13.10, 13.14, and 16.50Chapter 13.14 SCCC. [Ord. 2677, 1879; Ord. 2521, 1978; prior code § 3.59.020].
