A. Appointment of Housing Advisory Commissioner to the Santa Cruz County Continuum of Care Coordinating Group.

It was moved by Commissioner Sweet, seconded by Commissioner Carney and unanimously approved to have a Housing staff person familiar with the programs attend the meeting on May 20th and report back to the HAC.

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B. Farmworker Housing Pilot Program

Frank Brunings, Housing staff, made a presentation to the HAC on the current status of the program. He discussed the questions and comments collected by Commissioner Sprague (attached as a part of the Minutes), and stated that the main difficulty has been finding a suitable site on privately-owned farm land to do the project. Another challenge is obtaining State grants and other funding to cover the costs. This type of temporary housing would be designed for 12 single adult males. Other questions of whether tenants could be restricted to that farm's employees, transportation to services, exposure to pesticides, etc., affect site choice. The purpose of this program is to create low-cost decent, safe and sanitary farm worker housing, and the program is still open for discussion with interested farm owners.
