SUBJECT: Planning Commission Use Determination for 500,000 gallon ethanol distillation facility at 371 Calabasas Road, Watsonville (Whiskey Hill Farm, Blume), located in the Commercial Agricultural (CA) zoning district.

Members of the Planning Commission:

On May 8, 2020, a Pre-application/Consultation was submitted to the Planning Department by Ken Hart, Swift Consulting Services on behalf of the owner Mr. Blume. The primary objective of the Pre-application was to obtain a Use Determination and permitting information for a new ethanol distillery on a parcel located in the CA zone district. Upon evaluation, staff was unable to clearly identify a land use category under which a large-scale ethanol distillery would be classified, as this is a unique land use that is not clearly addressed in the County's Land Use Charts. In accordance with County Code Section 13.01.050, it was determined that the prudent next step would be to confer with the Planning Commission, with the goal of obtaining direction regarding the appropriate land use category for an ethanol distillery. The County Code provides for such Use Determinations to be made by the Commission upon referral by the Planning Director.

On June 15, 2020, the applicant submitted additional materials for the Planning Commission's consideration. The new materials include a scaled down proposal, from a 500,000 gallon ethanol distillery to a 150,000 gallon distillery and 150,000 gallon fertilizer manufacturing operation. Guidance from the Planning Commission on the scaled back proposal would be helpful to staff.

Project Description

The proposed project includes construction of a new ethanol alcohol distillery and processing facility, approximately 7,700 square feet in size, on a 14.5 acre parcel located in the CA zone district. The property is presently developed with approximately 215,000 square feet of greenhouses, a packing/cold storage facility, a single-family residence, barn, office building and several ancillary buildings. The proposed processing facility improvements would consist of a newly constructed 7,700 square foot canopy, several prefabricated shipping containers, processing equipment, and a series of tanks (max size 5,000 gallons).

The proposed distillery would facilitate production of both ethanol alcohol and fertilizer. Ethanol alcohol is a key ingredient in a variety of products, including alternative fuels and sanitizing products. Fertilizer would be a naturally occurring by-product of the distillation process. The distillery would be fueled by agricultural waste, both generated on the existing farm, and via delivery from farms located throughout the County. The waste would be fermented and distilled on site, with the alcohol and raw fertilizer that

is the by-product of the fermentation and distillation process. A portion of the alcohol and fertilizer produced would be utilized on-site, to support operation of the existing farm. A secondary by-product of the distillation process, methane, would also be utilized on-site (to fuel the existing boilers).

The bulk of the primary product, ethanol alcohol, would be sold and shipped off site to second party companies, to be utilized in the manufacturing of their products. Two such examples were provided in the materials provided by Blume; a hand sanitizer manufacturing company and the City of Watsonville, to power their fleet of city vehicles. The secondary product, fertilizer, would be utilized on site and shipped off-site for future sale to local agricultural operations.

Zoning & General Plan Analysis

Whiskey Hill Farm is located within the CA (Commercial Agriculture) zone district. The General Plan designation is AG (Agriculture). The subject parcel is classified as Type 3, "unique" farmland. The purpose of the CA district is "to preserve the commercial agricultural lands within Santa Cruz County which are a limited and irreplaceable natural resource, and enhance the general welfare of the County as a whole by preserving and protecting agriculture, one of the County's major industries. Within the CA Commercial Agriculture Zone, commercial agriculture shall be encouraged to the exclusion of other land uses which may conflict with it." The added designation as Type 1A farmland classifies the parcel as being "prime" or "unique" farmland or rangeland in accordance with the U.S. Department of Agriculture Soil Conservation Service and the California Department of Food and Agriculture criteria.

Principally permitted uses in the CA zone district include agricultural activities, such as farming, and agricultural support facilities, including single family residences, caretakers units, barns, greenhouses, and community energy systems.

Land Use Types to Consider

Agricultural Support Facility

In the proposal, Blume explored multiple potential permitting paths. One path would be to classify the proposed alcohol production facility as an accessory (to the primary agricultural) use under the use category of "agricultural support facility", which in accordance with SCCC 13.10.312 is defined as "a support facility for processing, packaging, drying, storage, and refrigeration of produce..." The production of 500,000 gallons of alcohol for the purpose of off-site sale to a hand sanitizer company and a government agency for fuel, and production of fertilizer for sale, does not appear to comport with the intent of this land use type. While the methane, fertilizer, and limited amounts of the alcohol proposed to be produced will be utilized on-site in support of the existing agriculture operation, the remaining 500,000 gallons of alcohol is proposed to be shipped off-site to for other purposes. Further, large quantities of raw off-site material would need to be brought onto the site to fuel the production facility. The volume, frequency or nature of the transport and storage of the agricultural waste that would be brought to the site, and the process of converting it into fertilizer, has not yet been made clear. It is uncertain whether an operation of this scale would be considered ancillary or accessory to the existing operation. Agricultural Support Facilities are permitted in the CA zone district with Level IV permit approval.

Winery

Another permitting path explored by Blume was to classify the proposed ethanol facility as a "winery". As defined in the Code, a winery is described as follows "winery means structures, facilities, and equipment used for the production of more than 200 gallons of wine per year. The production of wine means the conversion of grapes, berries, and other fruit into wines, including fermentation and bottling." While an ethanol alcohol production facility does entail the import of off-site agricultural product and fermentation of that product, it does not entail "the conversions of grapes, berries and other fruits into wine". Wineries with over 100,000 gallons of annual production are permitted in the CA zone district

with Level VI permit approval. One potential path would be to equate a "distillery" to a winery, however when discussed in the past as related to the draft Code Modernization, a distillery was considered to be for consumable alcohol such as scotch, gin or other alcohol and envisioned as smaller in scale than a 500,000 gallon operation. Nonetheless, if the Planning Commission were to determine that the proposed distillery was sufficiently similar to a large winery, then it could be considered through the Level VI permit process.

Energy Facility and Energy Facility - Community

Pursuant to the Code, an Energy Facility is defined as follows: "energy facility means any public or private processing, producing, generating, storing, transmitting, or recovering facility for electricity, natural gas, petroleum, coal, or other energy resource; excluding solar systems, wind energy conversion systems, and community energy systems. In reading the Blume project proposal, the applicant indicates that in the long-term, once the COVID 19 crisis is behind us and the need for increased hand sanitizer production has decreased, the ethanol alcohol produced by the facility would be used as a fuel source. The applicant provided Letters of Interest from two parties expressing interest in purchasing the ethanol for use as fuel, both from the Pajaro Valley School District (to fuel their school buses) and the City of Watsonville (to fuel their fleet of city vehicles).

In referencing back to the definition of "energy facility", a facility that produces ethanol, which is an energy resource, appears compatible with this use type. However, energy facilities are classified as primarily "industrial" uses and are not permitted in the Agricultural zone districts, such as the CA zone district.

Energy Facilities, *community*, <u>are</u> permitted in the CA zone district with Level V permit approval; however community energy facilities are defined in the Code as being "an energy producing facility which simultaneously produces *electricity and useful thermal energy* for use in more than one building; including all storage and transmission facilities associated with the community energy system." The proposed ethanol alcohol production facility would be producing an energy resource, but that resource is not electricity. Therefore, the proposed use would have to be judged as sufficiently similar to a community energy facility in order to be able to be considered in the CA zoning district through a Level V process (which staff would likely elect to elevate to a Level VI process given the off-site aspects of the use that are needed to support the one-site distillation use).

When full information about the energy production aspect of the project is available, an analysis of whether the project complies with policies in the General Plan and Climate Action Strategy addressing greenhouse gas emissions can be undertaken.

Agricultural Service Establishment

Pursuant to County Code, an Agricultural Service Establishment is defined as follows, "a business engaged in activities designed to support agricultural production and marketing such as application of agricultural chemicals, grading and irrigation contracting, harvesting, hauling of produce or other agricultural products, and large scale off-site cold storage facilities. This service does not include manufacturing or processing." The proposed facility would entail the production of two products that support agricultural production, ethanol, which can be used to fuel equipment and vehicles, and fertilizer, which can be used for soil enhancement. The proposed use does seem to fit the definition of an Agricultural Service Establishment, however that land use category is not a permitted use type in the CA zone district.

Manufacture of Fertilizer

Production and sale of fertilizer is envisioned as a third activity, along with the activities of distilling and energy production. The applicant has not provided information about the scale of the fertilizer production and the specific activities that would be undertaken on site to convert the agricultural waste

by-product into fertilizer and to prepare it for use on fields. The manufacture of fertilizer is only listed as an allowed use in the industrial uses chart, as appropriate for M-1 and M-2 zoning with discretionary approval and is not permitted in the Agricultural zone districts, such as the CA zone district.

The use chart does not anticipate the manufacture of fertilizer as an activity that would be associated with a different activity, such as the distillery, which would not normally be sited on M-1 or M-2 property. Direction is therefore sought on whether fertilizer production can be considered appropriate for CA in these circumstances, and if so, what would be appropriate limits on the scale and other characteristics of the operation.

Once information more information about the fertilizer aspect of the project is available, an analysis of whether the project complies with policies in the General Plan and Climate Action Strategy addressing greenhouse gas emissions can be undertaken.

Use Determination/Guidance

The County Code includes many land use categories, which cover a wide range of land uses; however, on occasion the Planning Department encounters a unique land use type or a project that involves a combination of land use types, which are not explicitly addressed in the Code. An ethanol alcohol distillery with associated energy and fertilizer production is one such situation. Guidance from the Planning Commission would serve to assist staff and the applicant in categorizing this land use type and inform the permitting path moving forward.

Whiskey Hill Farms Project Proposal

Introduction

Whiskey Hill farms applied to the Planning Department for a Project Consultation requesting a determination regarding a proposed use to produce fertilizer and alcohol as a part of its agricultural operation. That project consultation originally proposed the production of 4,500,000 gallons of liquid organic fertilizer and 500,000 gallons of alcohol. Since that time, the owners have scaled back this request and are now proposing a distillation operation capable of producing 150,000 gallons of fertilizer and 150,000 gallons of alcohol per year. The Planning Department has deferred this use determination to the Planning Commission. The purpose of this Study Session, therefore, is to request that the Planning Commission make a determination that a distillery capable of producing 150,000 gallons of liquid organic fertilizer and 150,000 gallons of alcohol from agricultural plant waste material is an allowed use in the Commercial Agriculture zone district.

Whiskey Hill Farms conducts agricultural activities on APN 049-171-21, located at 371 Calabasas Road (see attached parcel map). The parcel is estimated to be 14.542 acres in size and is developed with approximately 215,000 s.f. of green houses, a packing/cold storage facility, a single family residence; barn, older house adjacent to Calabasas Rd., office, storage and other ancillary buildings.

The Whiskey Hill Farms cultivation is the primary use on the property, occupying the existing green houses on the site. This is a commercial agricultural operation specializing in high value organic produce and has become the largest producer of organic turmeric in the continental United States within the past three years. Whiskey Hill Farms uses innovative regenerative and sustainable agricultural practices including organic fertilizer and use of energy created by the distillation of agricultural waste to enhance crop productivity and increase yields.

A distillery exists onsite that produces organic fertilizer and alcohol that is derived from agricultural plant waste. This distillery currently produces approximately 100,000 gallons of organic liquid fertilizer and 100,000 gallons of alcohol per year. The Covid-19 crisis has resulted in an acute shortage of sanitizing products, the active ingredient of which is alcohol. This severe shortage is being felt locally and around the world and the increased need for these products will grow well into the foreseeable future as new and better health and personal hygiene practices are adopted by communities and individuals everywhere. Whiskey Hill Farms has a unique opportunity to help meet the local demand for safe, plant-based and petroleum free organic sanitizer products. By scaling up their pilot plant to a system capable of producing 150,000 gallons for fertilizer and 150,000 gallons of alcohol per year, Whiskey Hill Farms will be able to help protect the tri-county area from pathogens and germ spread diseases.

In addition to the production of alcohol, the process results in creation of fertilizer and soil amendments. As described below, the project will provide benefits to other agricultural operations in the area by using their waste products to produce fertilizer.

Project Description

The physical improvements for the distillery facility will be located between an existing green house, office, and farm building (see site plan). This area is currently covered with a concrete slab. A metal canopy, approximately 1,100 SF in size, would be installed to cover the area for some of the tanks associated with the distillery. The remainder of the distillery would be located inside the adjacent building. The use in this existing building would comprise approximately 1,500 SF of floor space.

The following describes, in general terms, the processing of the agricultural plant waste material and the resulting products:

The feed stock for the distillery operation will be derived from plant biomass produced on-site, as well as importation of apple pulp and damaged apples that cannot be used in the juice making process. A portion of the plant biomass produced on-site will be grown in the existing green houses. The remainder will be derived from approximately seven acres of fallow land on the parcel that will be planted with sweet sorghum, coastal sugar cane, sugar beets, and turmeric. Together, these on-site sources will comprise 45% - 55% of the material needed for the distillation process.

Two fermentation processes are used to produce alcohol and fertilizer.

<u>First fermentation</u>: the plant material is first subjected to yeast fermentation (the same process that is required for production of wine by a winery operation). This initial fermentation produces CO2 gas which is used in the on-site green houses to spur plant growth and results in a liquid and a solid component. The liquid component is distilled; producing alcohol. The treatment of the solid component used to produce fertilizer is discussed below. As indicated above, Whiskey Hill Farms seeks to produce 150,000 gallons of alcohol per year. The following types of alcohol can be produced simply by employing different types of filtration during the finishing process:

Fuel grade alcohol
Beverage grade alcohol
Medical grade alcohol (i.e. sanitizer)
Pharmaceutical grade alcohol

Market conditions will dictate the type of alcohol to be produced. Initially, medical grade alcohol will be produced as the base ingredient for sanitizing products needed to combat the Covid-19 pandemic.

<u>Second fermentation:</u> Following this initial alcohol distillation process, the remaining solids are fermented again using bacteria, rather than yeast. This bacterial fermentation produces

methane (Renewable Natural Gas - RNG) and liquid fertilizer. The RNG will be used to fuel the on-site boiler (currently petroleum gas powered) and the fertilizer will be applied to the crops produced by Whiskey Hill Farms and delivered to other agricultural operations in the area. As indicated above, for every one gallon of fertilizer produced, one gallon of alcohol as a byproduct is distilled.

At full capacity, approximately five truckloads per month of the agricultural plant waste feedstock would be required for the operation. Approximately six truck trips per month are anticipated for shipping the alcohol and fertilizer. On average, seven trucks per day visit the site of the existing farm operations at Whiskey Hill Farms.

Project Objectives

This project has the following benefits:

Organic Fertilizer Production

The production of plant based, non-petroleum organic fertilizer will supply onsite needs as well as the needs of many other local agricultural operations in the area. In this way, it will support and complement onsite operations and the surrounding agricultural community as a whole.

Medical Grade Alcohol Production

As previously discussed, this project would initially produce medical grade alcohol, the key ingredient for disinfection products. The need for these products and the value of this project to supply that key ingredient cannot be stressed enough.

As an example of this pent up demand for sanitizing products, local news stations KION and KSBW aired pieces about the operation and the opportunity to produce alcohol from agricultural waste on April 10 and 11, respectively. That coverage included a method for the public to contact Whiskey Hill Farms to express interest in obtaining this product when available. The local news coverage was picked up by other news outlets and, within a 3 day period, Whiskey Hill Farms received 1,600 emails requesting this product. Email requests have continued to pour in. In addition to 20 letters of support for the project, primarily from local healthcare providers, we have included these initial 1,600 requests.

Cannabis manufacturers have signed Letters of Intent to purchase the highly purified alcohol product, once production commences, for use in the extraction process. It should be noted that cannabis manufacturing operations use alcohol in the extraction process and that alcohol is likely derived from GMO corn from the mid-west and

shipped across the country for use locally.

It is also important to note that alcohol-based sanitizers are required to be used in many facets of agricultural operations to prevent contamination and to ensure consumer safety. These requirements have been promulgated by the Food Safety Modernization Act (a more detailed description of these requirements is attached). Alcohol, itself, an agricultural product derived from agricultural crop-related biomass, plays an integral role on today's farms.

Fuel Grade Alcohol Production

It is envisioned that, once the Covid-19 crisis passes the operation will shift, in part, to the production of fuel grade alcohol. Prior to the onset of the Covid-19 crisis, Whiskey Hill Farms was in communication with the City of Watsonville regarding the production of alcohol to power their fleet and with the Pajaro Valley Unified School District (PVUSD) to fuel their buses to comply with State mandated phase out of the use of diesel fuel due to its extreme toxicity. These two entities could eventually use all of the 150,000 gallons produced per year by the proposed operation.

Efficient disposal and use of agricultural wastes

Presently, much of the agricultural byproduct from agricultural operations throughout the area is treated as waste. This proposal will turn this "waste" biomass into fertilizer and alcohol and reduce the waste stream gong to the County landfill.

The Buena Vista landfill will close before the year 2034. The County's Zero Waste Plan is intended to provide a framework for reducing waste that is disposed of in local landfills. One of the Zero Waste Strategy Components is to encourage all sectors to implement zero waste.

Policy and Regulatory Considerations

Proposal is an Allowed Use as an Agricultural Activity

Staff has raised the question as to whether this use would be ancillary or accessory to the agricultural use of the property.

An ancillary use is one that is subordinate to another use. The green houses on the site are approximately 215,000 SF in size. The proposed distillery footprint, including the addition of a new 1,100 SF metal canopy and the use of 1,500 SF of floor space in an existing building, would comprise 1.2% of the green house cultivation area. The area devoted to the distillery as a percentage of the overall agricultural use of the property becomes much smaller if factoring in the planting of the on-site fallow acreage for production of biomass. This calculation shows that

just 0.5% of the area devoted to cultivation would be used for distillation. The use of this small footprint would clearly be ancillary to the dominant cultivation activity on the parcel.

The definition of "accessory" is as follows: "a thing which can be added to something else in order to make it more useful, versatile, or attractive." The addition of distillation capabilities that result in the production of fertilizer and alcohol on this parcel would tremendously increase the value, usefulness, and versatility of the feed stock used in these processes – agricultural waste material being generated both on this site and on other, surrounding farms. The production of fertilizer from agricultural waste is clearly an accessory and ancillary use to the primary agricultural use of the property.

A distillery for the production of alcohol such as that being proposed is similar in many ways to a winery which is an allowed use in the CA zone. There is no requirement in the winery regulations that dictates the origin of the grapes to be used in the production of alcohol. Wineries do not rely solely on the grapes produced onsite for the production of wine, but commonly import a majority of the grapes used from vineyards located throughout and outside the county. As indicated previously, approximately 45% to 55% of the plant biomass to be used by Whiskey Hill Farm in the distillation process will be derived on-site.

Similarly, cannabis manufacturing is an allowed use in the CA zone and plant material from other permitted and licensed cultivation operations is used in these operations.

There is no justification to treat the production of alcohol from organic agricultural waste differently than the production of wine, particularly in light of the fact that beverage grade alcohol would be produced. In addition, the versatility of this proposed use (production of fertilizer and alcohol that can be used for a variety of purposes) is similar to the multiple purposes for which cannabis can be used (recreational purposes, medical uses, and fiber in the case of hemp) and should be treated similarly.

A zoning code cannot anticipate and explicitly list each and every use. This is especially true when, over time, new uses and new technologies emerge that are embraced by the agricultural industry. This evolution of industry needs and standards must be taken into account when applying regulatory requirements. Uses that are similar to those that are explicitly listed as an allowed use need to be evaluated and permitted taking this broader view.

As previously mentioned, the production of alcohol would, following an eventual reduction in the need for sanitizing products, be used as a fuel source. A market for this fuel has already been shown to exist for powering the City of Watsonville vehicle fleet and Pajaro Valley Unified School District buses. As such, the production of alcohol on the property meets the definition of an energy facility, which is an allowed use within the CA zone district. While the Agriculture Uses chart lists "Energy facilities, community" as a Conditional Use, there is no definition for "Energy

facility, community" in 13.10.700-E. Definitions include "Energy facility" and "Energy system, community":

"Energy facility" means any public or private processing, producing, generating, storing, transmitting, or recovering facility for electricity, natural gas, petroleum, coal or other energy resource; excluding solar energy systems (refer to SCCC 13.10.700-S), wind energy conversion systems (refer to SCCC 13.10.700-W), and community energy systems (refer to this section).

"Energy system, community" means an energy producing facility which simultaneously produces electricity and useful thermal energy for use in more than one building; including all storage and transmission facilities associated with the community energy system. [Ord. 5083 § 3, 2010; Ord. 3501 § 17, 1984; Ord. 3432 § 1, 1983].

We believe that the proposed use meets the definition of "energy facility" contained in the definitions section of Chapter 13.10, as it comprises a production facility for fuel grade alcohol and hot water heated by RNG.

In addition, the proposed use should be viewed as compatible with the purposes for which the CA zone district was established, as it would serve to efficiently and effectively use plant material waste generated by agricultural operations in the area – wastes that would otherwise need to be disposed of at the County landfill.

Finally, the proposed use would help preserve agricultural land by providing an economic benefit from the use of material that would otherwise be considered a waste product. The use of emerging technologies and approaches to farming that bring financial benefits to the farming community helps to ensure that farming continues to be economically feasible and, therefore, contributes to the preservation of agricultural land.

The County of Santa Cruz, through the adoption of the General Plan, Climate Action Strategy, and the Strategic Plan 2018-2024 clearly supports local energy production and solid waste reduction. The following are policies and goals intended to support those important objectives. We believe that these policies support the type of use being proposed at the Whiskey Hill Farm/Whiskey Hill Farms property:

General Plan Policies

Policy 5.14.8 – Encourage Biomass Cultivation: Encourage the cultivation of crops for biomass fuels without displacing existing agricultural production, especially when such biomass production makes use of marginal land or of crop residues and when the fuel or energy produced is consumed within Santa Cruz County.

While not being specifically cultivated as biomass for energy production, this agricultural plant waste material will be efficiently and effectively used to create energy in a way that complements an existing agricultural use with no detrimental effects on that use.

Policy 5.17.1 – Promote Alternative Energy Sources: Promote the use of energy sources which are renewable, and less environmentally degrading than non-renewable fossil fuels.

Policy 15.17.4: Encourage and stimulate energy conservation and the use of renewable energy through retrofit programs for residential, agricultural, commercial, public facilities and industrial land uses.

The proposed use is very much in keeping with these policies by producing fuel from material that would otherwise be disposed of — material that would actually create climate change gasses if put in a landfill. The use would actually produce fuel in a manner that is far superior to the production and use of non-renewable fossil fuels.

Policy 7.24.8 – Meeting State and Local Landfill Diversion Goals: Consider mandatory recycling or material-specific landfill disposal prohibitions if state and local landfill diversion goals are not met through the use of voluntary programs.

Policy 7.25.8 – Recyclable Materials in Landfills: Consider adoption of landfill disposal bans for specific recyclable or compostable materials where necessary to achieve County materials recovery and landfill diversion goals.

The benefits of this type of waste diversion to our local landfill cannot be understated, given the limited remaining life span of the Buena Vista landfill and the need to transport waste generated in Santa Cruz County to Marina following its closure.

Policy 7.25.11 – Methane Gas: Develop and implement a program for the recovery of landfill methane gas for conversion to electricity or direct use as a fuel.

The secondary fermentation process to develop fertilizer will generate RNG which would replace the use of petroleum-based "natural" gas to fuel the boiler that heats the onsite green houses. No methane will be released to the atmosphere.

Climate Action Strategy

E-4.1 Seek funding for a study to identify renewable energy resources in the County and advise on how the amount of renewable energy generated within the County may be increased over short-, medium-, and long-term.

This is a desirable objective and the proposed project would demonstrate the viability of this type of renewable energy production within the County. Whiskey Hill Farms has a long history of sharing its techniques and strategies for regenerative agriculture with the public, UC Santa Cruz students, public school classes and other interested groups. It has been a featured site on the Ecological Farming Conference bus tours, foreign trade group tours, and other organized "green" and farm tours.

Table 3-3: Strategies for the Reduction of Greenhouse Gases from Solid Waste Priority Strategy:

W-3 Reduce the amount of solid waste, particularly recyclable and compostable materials, in the commercial and residential waste stream

Again, this proposed project would have a direct effect on reducing the waste stream to the local landfill and would also provide an example about the viability of this approach.

Strategic Plan 2018-2024

The Santa Cruz County Strategic Plan 2018-2024 outlines a number of objectives to be pursued by County government. The Strategic Plan establishes a vision, mission, values, focus areas and goals for the County of Santa Cruz. The Plan establishes goals in a number of focus areas that, if achieved, will enhance the local economy, environment, and quality of life for county residents. Two of these focus areas in particular are germane to the evaluation of the proposed project on the Whiskey Hill Farm property. These relate to achieving a Sustainable Environment and a Dynamic Economy.

The "Sustainable Environment" focus area indicates that the County intends to "support and strengthen efforts for clean air and water, conservation, renewable energy, recycling and reuse."

This project would directly support these efforts through producing clean renewable energy by using agricultural waste as feed stock.

The "Dynamic Economy" focus area contains an element reflecting the need to "strengthen and retain small businesses and key sectors through innovation, flexibility and technology."

This project would use an innovative approach using proven technology to turn a waste product into a marketable commodity, thereby producing an additional revenue stream attributable to this agricultural property and augmenting the long term agricultural viability of operations on the parcel.

In summary, the forgoing are all desirable policies and objectives established by the County to further sustainability and environmental protection. The proposed use can clearly implement these policies in a manner that complements the existing use of the property without resulting in any negative effects on the existing agricultural use.

Required Special Findings

The proposed project meets the development standards for the CA zone district contained in County Code Chapter 13.10.313 and the required special findings contained in Chapter 13.10.314 can be made:

(1) That the establishment or maintenance of this use will enhance or support the continued operation of commercial agriculture on the parcel and will not reduce, restrict or adversely affect agricultural resources, or the economic viability of commercial agricultural operations, of the area.

The agricultural use on the property includes the production of organic herbs and vegetables in existing green houses. The proposed production of fertilizer will support and enhance this use. While the primary and immediate use of the alcohol produced will be as a key ingredient in sanitizer (to be produced off site), it is anticipated that a portion of the alcohol will also be used to power the on-site boiler used to heat the green houses and power farm vehicles, replacing use of gasoline and diesel. In addition, the process for producing alcohol involves fermentation of agricultural plant wastes. This process produces fertilizer and heat that will be used to reduce reliance on the boilers need to heat the green houses. Finally, the use will benefit agricultural resources and the economic viability of agricultural operations in the area by affording an alternative method for disposal of waste plant material to surrounding agricultural operations and by the production of fertilizer for local use.

(2)(a) That the use or structure is ancillary, incidental or accessory to the principal agricultural use of the parcel.

The proposed use is accessory to and complements the agricultural use of the property; in that cultivation within the 215,000 SF of green houses by Whiskey Hill Farms is the principal use of the parcel. The use would increase the value, usefulness, and versatility of agricultural waste material though it's reuse and repurposing.

In addition, a distillery for the production of fertilizer, alcohol, and fuel is similar in many ways to a winery which is an allowed use in the CA zone. Wineries do not rely solely on the grapes produced onsite for the production of wine, but import grapes from numerous vineyards located throughout and outside the county. Similarly, cannabis manufacturing is

also an allowed use in the CA zone and plant material from other permitted and licensed cultivation operations is imported from these other properties. Because this use is similar to these others that are explicitly listed as allowed uses, a similar framework for evaluation and findings of consistency can be applied.

(3) That single-family residential uses will be sited to minimize conflicts, and that all other uses will not conflict with commercial agricultural activities on-site, where applicable, or in the area.

A residential use of the property already exists and this project will not change or affect that use.

(4) That the use will be sited to remove no land from production (or potential production) if any non-farmable potential building site is available, or if this is not possible, to remove as little land as possible from production.

The use will be sited in a 30 foot wide area between two existing structures on the property. This area is not farmable and has absolutely no potential to be farmed.


Summary

In summary, we are requesting that the Planning Department find that the proposed use for the production of fertilizer and alcohol (as an ingredient in sanitizer now and as a fuel or other products in the future) is consistent with the intent of the General Plan and Zoning Ordinance.

We understand that a full application for a Minor Variation to the existing Use Permit and a Building Permit will be required. The cost of the applications is significant, so it is imperative that we get confirmation of the consistency of this use with the Zoning Ordinance and General Plan policies and objectives.



Requirement for Alcohol Based Sanitizers in Agricultural Operations

Alcohol-based sanitizers are required to be used in many facets of agricultural operations to prevent contamination and to ensure consumer safety. Alcohol, itself, an agricultural product because it is derived from commercially produced plant material, plays an integral role on today's farms.

The US Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA) was signed into law on January 4, 2011 and aims to ensure the safe supply of food by preventing contamination rather than responding to it. It is said to be the most significant reform pertaining to food safety in decades. The FDA has adopted various rules to implement the FSMA, including those covering produce safety. These Standards for the Growing, Harvesting, Packing, and Holding of Produce for Human Consumption require regular sanitation of a myriad of food processing and other equipment found on most farms. The following is a <u>partial</u> list of the items requiring regular sanitizing:

produce washers

de-mudders

disinfectant sprayer,

harvest crates

harvest knives

packing tables

floors

scales

harvest tools cultivation tools

shoe soles forklift wheels plastic pallets,

pallet jack wheels

plastic nursery supplies computer entry stations

bulk filling hoses

pumps

air lines

doorknobs

tractor steering wheels and gear/transmission levers

pressure washer wands

drainage tables

greenhouse sliding doors



As can be seen, the use of alcohol for compliant agricultural operations is required and is widespread. Production of that alcohol should also be seen as an agricultural operation.

Dear Kathy and Jocelyn;

Whiskey Hill Farms is proposing to install equipment necessary to produce organic fertilizer and alcohol on their property located at 371 Calabasas Road in Watsonville. The Executive Committee has reviewed information provided to us which describes the proposal in some detail and we want to communicate the Farm Bureau's support for this project. Further, the Farm Bureau urges the Planning Department to find that this use is consistent with the applicable policies and regulations for properties in the Commercial Agriculture Zone District.

The greenhouses on the property are currently used to produce organic herbs and vegetables. Clearly, the crops require fertilizer and, for the type of crops being produced, the greenhouses themselves require the input of energy to function to their maximum efficiency. The production of fertilizer and alcohol on site should be seen as a necessary component of this agricultural operation.

Further, we understand that the alcohol produced will be used, at least initially, as the base ingredient for sanitizing products. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, these products are in critically short supply and the production of alcohol from agricultural waste by the method being proposed is a truly elegant solution – transformation of what would otherwise be considered a waste product into not one, but two extremely useful products.

The fact that the operation would import feed stock material from off site and result in a net export of the resulting fertilizer and alcohol should, by no means, restrict the ability to carry out this function. The test should be whether the use is ancillary to the agricultural use on the property. The use <u>is</u> ancillary in that, as described above, it would provide necessary support (fertilizer and alcohol fuel) to the primary activity or operation. The project would supply all of the fertilizer needs for the property and, through the use of the alcohol to power the boilers used to heat the greenhouses, the need for propane for this purpose would cease.

Farms and farming operations should not be seen as independent of one another, but rather as interconnected and interdependent. Wineries on Commercial Agriculture zoned land, usually with an onsite vineyard, require the input of material from other farms to produce their wine and that activity is seen as an ancillary use. Similarly, composting of agricultural waste for the production of soil amendments is another common activity that is seen on lands zoned Commercial Agriculture.

Finally, the equipment needed for the fermentation and distillation processes would be located on a very small area between existing buildings that is not farmable now or in the future. For the forgoing reasons, the Santa Cruz County Farm Bureau urges the County find that the proposed use is allowed at 371 Calabasas Road.

I am writing in support of the proposal by Whiskey Hill Farms to build an organic alcohol co-product plant at their farm at 371 Calabasas Road in Watsonville.

My wife and I have operated Greensward / New Natives organic farm in Corralitos since 1983. I am also a member of the Santa Cruz County Agricultural Policy Advisory Commission (APAC).

David Blume and Whiskey Hill Farms has been operating at their current location for 10+ years.

In my recent visit to Whiskey Hill Farm I found a self-contained operation utilizing organic waste and processing by products to produce alcohol at scale. There were no objectionable odors or unsightly conditions present. The plant was in operation and was very quiet.

They propose to upgrade their operation to produce a larger volume of alcohol-based co-products derived from organic waste that would otherwise be taken to the County landfill. In addition the plant will produce organic fertilizer which is always in demand. It will be easy for local farms to absorb this volume of organic fertilizer. Thereby reducing the carbon foot print of Pajaro Valley agriculture and reducing the cost of fertilizer transportation from out the area.

On our farm we are currently in short supply of alcohol based hand sanitizers, with no steady supply in sight.

It's pretty great that Whiskey Hill can utilize the local apple and grape pomace from juice/wine production as one of their inputs. A nice return to the Pajaro Valley's roots and a nod to the future.

I find the Whiskey Hill Farm proposal to be ancillary and beneficial to agriculture in Santa Cruz County.

Dear Kathy and Jocelyn:

Whiskey Hill Farms seeks to expand their agricultural operation, producing fertilizer to be used on site, by installing equipment to convert local agricultural waste to fertilizer and alcohol. Many intense farm operations, like the subject greenhouse, mix fertilizer for onsite application from products purchased from third parties, as a common agricultural practice. Farmers try to reduce their waste stream by composting cuttings, for later application, and tilling in unsold produce instead of hauling it to the dump. To a large extent the proposed use is no different.

Growers on the Central Coast, including Santa Cruz County, have been very innovative in changing farming practices to reduce local environmental impacts. Good examples are irrigation reduction with drip systems and managed fertilizer applications to minimize excess tailwater. Many crops are processed away from the farm. Processing results in Ag waste. Processors have long sold this to dairy and cattle farms. Not all processing byproducts are suitable for cattle and can add to the landfill where they may contribute to methane discharge, which should be minimized or captured.

The Whiskey Hill proposal to use apple juice retentate as a source for the fertilizer and alcohol production is in essence recycling an existing waste stream and reducing discharge. This innovative environmental solution by a grower, which benefits other agricultural producers, should be encouraged.

The proposed activity is entirely consistent with agricultural uses on CA zoned land. It benefits the existing agricultural use on property and has no impact on adjacent parcels. The proposed use should be allowed.

I am writing in support of the proposal from Whiskey Hill Farms to put a commercial organic fertilizer, livestock feed and alcohol co-product plant at their farm at 371 Calabasas Road in Watsonville.

They propose to upgrade their operation to produce organic fertilizer and alcohol-based co-products derived from agricultural waste that would otherwise be taken to the County landfill. The proposed upgrade would enable them to produce 1,200,000 gallons of organic liquid fertilizer (needed by organic farmers throughout the Tri-county area) as well as 500,000 gallons organic, alcohol-based and safe sanitizer products as well as some alcohol-based diesel replacement fuel annually.

I have worked in agriculture since 1980, having farmed for almost 20 years and continuing to work as an agricultural consultant and Technical Service Provider with NRCS up to the present. I am also a member of the Santa Cruz County Agricultural Policy Advisory Commission (APAC).

I have known David Blume and the Whiskey Hill Farms for many years, and I led an Ecological Farming Association Bus Tour to the farm several years ago. This is an active certified organic farm that produces a wide variety of standard and unusual fruits and vegetables, in a creative and biodiverse habitat.

The farm produces on-site waste from its production practices, as do all farms, and it plans to bring in and utilize extra agricultural waste to supplement their on-site supply. This is similar to the way wineries bring in product from other vineyards, and is consistent as ancillary to the agricultural use of the property.

Additionally, the location of the proposed plant is for a site between two buildings that is not farmed, and thus, farmland would not be removed for this project.

I believe that this proposed project is a good one for the continuation of agriculture in the Pajaro Valley.

Oh, Oh Organic, Inc. distributes organic and natural ingredients into cosmetic and over-the-counter drug manufacturers though-out the United States and Canada. We have been in this business for twenty years.

It is our observation that there are a very limited number of manufacturers and distributors of USP ethanol for use in cosmetics (denatured). There appear to be 10 to 12 organically certified distillers spread across the country, although it is hard to know their focus, many produce vodkas and other spirits as opposed to Ethanol USP. I have never seen any of them at a cosmetic ingredient trade show and we have not seen them participating in the industry at large. There are two large Ethanol USP manufacturers (Remet and Pharmco) commonly used in the industry. There are the only ones I've seen over the past years participating in the industry. There is a clear need for more competition and supply.

Additionally, the organic and natural cosmetic space is expected to be at around 25% of the total cosmetic industry by 2025. This too will necessitate greater supply. An organic ethanol producer in California will find a rich market here as about 50% of all cosmetics are made in California.

Finally, the increased awareness of the need for sanitization has dried up the current supply of ethanol. It is clear that we need a California based supplier.

The proposed production by Blume Distillation and MBRF1 with their unique process for plant based, petroleum free USP alcohol will meet the need outlined above. Additionally, the project they are working on with our company will provide a line of sanitizers that are critical to healthy communities throughout California.
